Branch Nominees for 2022 AAUW MN Young Women for Equity Awards

AAUW Minnesota gives two annual Young Women for Equity awards, one at the high school level (\$500) and the second at the college level (\$1,000), to recognize and reward young women whose projects, activities, and leadership address equity issues. The Duluth branch is proud to sponsor two outstanding applicants.

<u>High School level</u>: NATALIE MILLER, a senior at East High School, won 1st place at National History Day for her 2020 Senior paper, "Too Strong for a Woman: How Bernice Sandler Created Title IX to Break Barriers for Female Faculty in Higher Education." She's won a Yale Book Award, a Youth Civic Engagement Scholarship, and is a 2021 AP Scholar. She plans to study next year at Yale and then attend law school.

<u>College level</u>: LAITZIA YANG, a UMD Biology major/Early Childhood Studies minor, is the current UMD Student Association Director of Equity and Inclusion. Her accomplishments include work with the Women's Resource and Action Center on the upcoming event "Remembering Our Stories," which addresses sexual violence and survivor empowerment, and the Antiracist Literacy Advisory Board. Her research with the latter focuses on representations of women and children as well as underrepresented populations, and her responsibilities in this initiative include a Praxis project on curriculum and course offerings to advance equity, diversity, and inclusion.

Christy Lefteri, *The Beekeeper of Aleppo* (2019)

Millions of Ukrainian refugees provide the latest horrific spotlight on war and displacement. But statistics and news reports cannot get at the heart of what it FEELS like to be a refugee. Paradoxically, fiction may be the best way to do so.

Christy Lefteri, the child of Cypriot refugees who resettled in England and a volunteer at a refugee center in Athens in 2016 and 2017, has written such a book. A bestseller, it has received many awards including the 2020 Aspen Words Literary Prize, cosponsored with National Public Radio, which is given for a work of fiction illuminating "a vital contemporary issue."

The Beekeeper of Aleppo tells the story of Nuri Ibrahim, a beekeeper, and his artist wife, Afra, who are forced to flee their happy life in Aleppo, Syria. Traumatized by war and personal tragedy, they embark on a dangerous journey through Turkey and Greece to an uncertain future in Britain. The (London) Observer review concluded, "It's impossible not to be moved." Put it on your reading list.
