A Note from Public Policy Officer, Jackie Falk

Looking forward to Public Policy:

Next year is a bonding year in the Minnesota legislature, reducing action on policy; however, the ERA to the Minnesota State Constitutions is expected to be taken up again. When it passes in the legislature, we will need significant funds and volunteer efforts to get a majority of Minnesota voters to approve it in November 2024. Kelsey Waits, MN AAUW vice-president for Public Policy, hopes to provide trainings this coming year so we will be ready.

Diversity Officer's Pick: *The Power Code*..., by Katty Kay and Claire Shipman (2023)

The full title of this newly published book on women and leadership is The **Power Code: More Joy.** Less Ego. Maximum Impact for Women (and Everyone). Using extensive research, its authors argue that women view and use their power differently than men. Indeed, females actually define "power" differently and may not even want it in its traditional, patriarchal, meaning. For example, females see power as achieving an end

result; whereas males see power as exerting control over someone else.

In fields such as the police and the military, Kay and Shipman discuss added barriers specific to females, such as personal protective gear being designed around a man's body. Women are also more subject to perfectionism, both in their own expectations of themselves and in others' expectations of

them. Men, by contrast, tend to be rewarded on the basis of promise, not performance.

The biggest challenge may not be a woman's boss but her partner/husband—household tasks and childminding still fall disproportionately on women. Not only is this unfair; it also means that men are missing out on caregiving and community work. So let's not try to remake women; let's remake power.
